SUBJECT: Video-Teleconferencing Planning Meeting

I met with members of the Immigration and Naturalization Service on February 23, 1999, in order to discuss the placement of video-teleconferencing equipment.

In Fiscal Year 1999, the INS has money for twenty units to be used in conjunction with the IHP. The purpose of this meeting was to go over the INS district requests and EOIR requests solicited from the Court Administrators through the ACIJs. In Senate appropriations language, the INS had been directed to concentrate on three of the Big Five states: California, Texas, and Florida and to "consult with" both appropriations committees before implementation. Controller Lynn Petersburg provided the attached document to XO Jack Summers earlier this week. It indicates that we are running a surplus in the interpreter contract of \$802,058. Some of that estimate is based upon "initial" figures, so I think the "surplus" might be smaller. Whatever the amount, I suggest we carry it forward to next year. I believe that this would be wise, since the wide-spread use of telephonic interpreters is still being tested under the new policy, and the possibility exists for initiatives such as ABC to cause an increase in case filings (which leads to more hearings and more contract interpreter costs).

In addition, Ms. Petersburg indicated that there is a projected surplus of \$320,000 in detail travel. I have reviewed our continuing speaker phone needs<sup>1</sup> and the need to expand video-teleconferencing (VTC) capability. I suggest the following:

OPAT estimates the cost of a speaker phone at \$1250. Therefore, the total cost would be \$133,750.

I also suggest that we use an additional money to purchase VTC units. The costs of these units is estimated at \$7000, and approximately \$10,000 including installation.<sup>2</sup> We could purchase an additional 10 units, for a total cost of about \$100,000. We suggest VTC units for the following locations:

CHI PHO WAS (for CLE and CIN) ELO PHI (move INS unit to Pittsburg and replace) POO (in extra courtroom) SPD HOD BOS (in Judge Ragno's courtroom) SEA (move INS unit to Takoma and replace)

Finally, we would like to replace the antiquated phone system in Philadelphia. We anticipate that a small system, including voice mail, will cost approximately \$35,000.

This would leave in excess of \$50,000 of the projected detail travel "surplus" to cover any lastminute travel needs.



Video Technology Equipment for Potential Immigration Court Hearing Locations

This chart depicts potential hearing locations in which video technology could potentially be used. It is based upon the following cost structure:

\$30,000 Purchase price for system at each location

\$1,000 Travel, site visit

\$2,000 Cable placement, site modification

\$33,000 Total cost for installation at each location.

It must be noted that several Immigration Courts already have video equipment installed (Baltimore, Dallas, Oakdale, and Philadelphia) and that several state departments of correction have their own video systems (Florida, Illinois, and Massachusetts).

The total cost of adding video capability for the hearing locations depicted in this chart is \$1,386,000.

These recommendations are presented assuming that Phoenix and Florence, Salt Lake City, San Francisco, St. Louis, and St. Louis detained have the equipment which was been promised. Video Teleconferencing (VTC) is an electronic form of communication that permits two or more people in different locations to engage in audio and visual exchanges. Court proceedings, meetings, training, and conferences may be conducted as if all the participants are present together. Viewed as an alternative communications resource, this technology is seen as a money saving, time saving, alternative to travel.<sup>1</sup>

During 1994, a six month test of the application of video teleconferencing (VTC) technology to the deportation process was conducted by Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), the Bureau of Prisons (BOP), and the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) between the Chicago Immigration Court and the BOP Medical Center in Lexington, KY. In mid-1995, a larger pilot project was instituted between three EOIR courts and respective detention/IHP locations: the Oakdale Immigration Court and Oakdale FCI, (IHP); the Baltimore Immigration Court and the Wicomico (MD) County Jail, (INS detention); and the Dallas Immigration Court and the BOP facility at Big Spring, TX (IHP). What started as a tentative foray into the technological age has, with the approval and encouragement of former Attorney General Janet Reno, grown into a multi-site operation, dealing with over a thousand cases a year. Funding has come from the INS, EOIR and various states. No longer "cutting edge" in it's application, only the manner of hearings, the ease of use and improvements in the technology are cause for comment.

As with the use of personal computers over the last twenty years, a novelty evolving into a requirement, so it is with VTC. Use in private business, state and Federal Government, law enforcement, the courts at many levels and many offices of the Department itself requires that Immigration Courts accept this technology openly and to use it to our best advantage. This will include hearings, training, conference meetings, and interviews. It is believed that the savings to the Courts in reference to time, money and safety will be significant. It is also believed that cooperation with the INS and various state and local jurisdictions in the use of this technology will greatly impact their willingness to accommodate our mission to provide Immigration hearings in a timely and cost effective manner.

The six month pilot project between the Chicago Immigration Court and Lexington was considered a success by the INS and they received funding for expansion of the program. The second phase included the Oakdale Immigration Court/Oakdale FCI, the Baltimore Immigration Court/Wicomico County Jail (MD) and the Dallas Immigration Court/Big Spring (BOP) facility. During FY 1997, the INS had funding for fourteen units and placed seven of them. At the beginning of FY 1998, the remaining seven units were assigned and proposed sites for an additional twenty sites (funded by FY 1998 money) were evaluated. Over the course of FY'98, these sites were also decided upon by INS with input and concurrence by OCIJ. The funding for FY 1999 came with Congressional directions to the INS to concentrate on three of the Big Five (greatest number of foreign born nationals) States, California, Texas and Florida, and to consult with the Appropriations

Committees before making a final determination on the twenty sites being funded. All sites were to be instrumental in the carrying out of the Institutional Removal Program. The FY 1999 Omnibus Appropriations Bill also earmarked three million dollars from the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) program in order for states to increase their role in identifying illegal and criminal aliens in their custody and notifying INS. In many cases, while INS funded the equipment for their offices, sub-offices and the Immigration Courts, they would also assist the states and counties in applying for COPS funding to purchase complimentary equipment.

Funding from INS for FY 2000 for additional equipment did not materialize, and EOIR assumed responsibility for future VTC funding requests to Congress. During FY 2001/2002IR purchased and installed seventeen units. It is our responsibility that these units be placed in areas where they will be used and incorporated into the standard operating procedures of the Courts.

Acceptance of the use of VTC for Immigration Court hearings has varied over time and by location. It has been and continues to be the policy of the Chief Immigration Judge that after the initial Master Calendar hearing, it is up to the discretion of the individual Immigration Judge whether or not to require an in-person hearing. As with many innovations, negative feelings are based more in the "not knowing" aspect of the situation. Once training has been acquired, and the first hearings have been held, it usually becomes quite acceptable to Court personnel. Experience not only breeds comfort with the system but brings suggestions and new ideas forward. Most courts are now in possession of a document camera to assist with identification of material, and many have requested a quiet, fast, dedicated fax machine in the courtroom itself.

Immigration Court personnel make every effort to accommodate the needs of a respondent or the respondent's representative when the respondent is in a remote VTC hearing site. The representative may be granted time prior to the commencement of the hearing in order to confer with his/her client. Courts may take a brief recess during the hearing to allow the representative to confer with his/her client. Representatives should not be required to travel to remote VTC sites where the respondents are located. Hopefully, this will encourage pro bono participation by the private bar. 

DHS/ICE - Department of Homeland Security/Immigration and Customs Enforcement

IGA - Intergovernmental Agreement

IGSA - Intergovernmental Service Agreement - A contract between DHS and a state, county or municipal government obligating the INS to reimburse the other agency for the costs of housing DHS detainees.

SPC - Service Processing Centers - Owned and operated by DHS. Uses contract guard services to perform basic custodial duties.

Pursuant to our meeting with DHS, during which concerns were raised regarding the identification and resolution of issues the Immigration Courts are having with video conferencing (VC) equipment. IRM has initiated a series of activities designed to identify, troubleshoot, and resolve issues impacting the effective use of video conferencing equipment in the Immigration Courts.

Commencing this week, Marsha Maddox from IRM will contact each Court Administrator (CA) with EOIR provided video conferencing equipment and discuss any difficulties they have had or are currently experiencing with their VC equipment. Marsha will document the content of the conversation and remind the CA to contact the IRM Help Desk should they incur any problems. The IRM Help Desk and supporting Government and contract engineers have been advised that calls pertaining to VC equipment are to be given a priority response. In addition, we have modified the IRM Help Desk system to produce a weekly report of all calls pertaining to VC. IRM management will review this report weekly to ensure our prompt resolution of these issues and identify trends. Finally, Marsha will initiate subsequent calls to the CA's to gain additional feedback on the process, foster communication, and identify additional issues that may arise.

IRM is committed to identifying and resolving any problems the Courts are experiencing with video conferencing. Please remind the Courts that use of the Help Desk is an essential ingredient in this effort and critical to our success. We look forward to supporting the continued growth of video conferencing capabilities in the Immigration Courts.

#### Abstract

The impact on the Immigration Court's proceedings from the implementation of videoconferencing equipment between the San Antonio Immigration Court and the Laredo Service Processing Center was examined. An examination of the literature was conducted to ascertain the most often discussed benefits and liabilities associated with the utilization of videoconferencing technology in the courts. The reported advantages and disadvantages were then compared to the Laredo videoconferencing project in an attempt to determine the overall effectiveness of the project. The importance of procedures, project management, training, and staffing on the effective implementation of a videoconferencing system were also discussed. The initial results, based on an examination of the data available and interviews with various individuals involved with the project, indicated the videoconferencing project was successful in terms of cost effectiveness, case processing efficiency, security enhancement, and reduction of health concerns.

#### Videoconferencing: Laredo

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#### Utilization of Videoconferencing in Immigration Court Proceedings:

#### The Laredo Project

On a hot August day at the Service Processing Center in Laredo, Texas a detention guard escorts a group of detained aliens into a small courtroom before an Immigration Judge for hearings on the charges brought against each of them by the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (USINS). The group consists of nine aliens with records of criminal violations in the United States ranging from various drug charges to murder, six aliens charged with smuggling other aliens into the United States, and five aliens charged with entering the United States without inspection. The Immigration Judge, the USINS Assistant District Counsel, two local private bar attorneys with clients among the group, and the interpreter/court clerk wait as the guard arranges the group of shackled men on four pews in the courtroom per the judge's instructions. Except for the two private bar attorneys, all of the court personnel drove 165 miles from San Antonio, Texas in order to conduct a week of immigration hearings at the detention facility. Even though a guard is present in the courtroom, security concerns exist among the individuals assigned to conduct and assist with these immigration hearings. In addition to security concerns, some of the personnel present in the courtroom are concerned over possible exposure to communicable diseases such as tuberculosis and hepatitis B.

The Immigration Judge conducts the rights advisals, takes pleadings on the charges, considers any form of relief, if any, available to the individuals, and renders a decision in each case. The orders are then distributed to all the parties. These immigration proceedings are completed without any type of incident, as are the other immigration hearings scheduled for the week. In approximately two to three weeks, another Immigration Judge and interpreter/court

clerk from the San Antonio Immigration Court, as well as another USINS Assistant District Counsel, will travel to the Laredo Service Processing Center (LSPC) for another week of immigration hearings.

One year later, on another hot August day, the LSPC guard escorts a group of aliens into the facility courtroom. He arranges the group of detainees on the four pews per the instructions of the presiding Immigration Judge. Each of the 15 aliens charged by the USINS has criminal records which include aggravated assault, drug trafficking, grand theft, and murder. Again, the Immigration Judge, the USINS Assistant District Counsel, and the interpreter/court clerk are present in the courtroom. Also two San Antonio attorneys who rarely, if ever, represent aliens housed at LSPC are present in the courtroom.

The Immigration Judge again conducts the rights advisals, takes pleadings on the charges, considers any form of relief, if any, available to the individuals, and renders a decision in each case. The orders are then distributed to all the parties. After the completion of the hearings, the Immigration Judge returns to her office within the San Antonio Immigration Court in order to prepare for a non-detained individual merits hearing scheduled for that afternoon. Unlike the previous year, the Immigration Judge, as well as the other personnel in the courtroom, have no safety or health concerns during these proceedings. The following morning another Immigration Judge and interpreter/court clerk from the San Antonio Immigration Court, as well another USINS Assistant District Counsel, will conduct hearings from San Antonio on a group of aliens being held at LSPC.

The above two scenarios briefly describe the immigration hearings conducted at LSPC before and after videoconferencing equipment was installed between the San Antonio Immigration

Court and LSPC in July, 1997. The primary focus of this paper will be to describe the implementation process of the Laredo videoconferencing project and to discuss the effectiveness of the project, not only in terms of cost effectiveness, but also whether or not the utilization of the videoconferencing equipment in immigration proceedings has to some degree addressed the notion of "justice delayed is justice denied".

#### **Background Information**

The Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) was created through a Department of Justice (DOJ) reorganization in January, 1983. This internal reorganization combined the Immigration Judge function with the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA). Prior to this change, the Immigration Judge function had been the responsibility of USINS employees. EOIR is a completely separate agency from the USINS, which is the agency responsible for the enforcement of the immigration laws. Until March of 1987, EOIR consisted of the Office of the Director, the BIA, which heard appeals of immigration decisions, and the Office of the Chief Immigration Judge (OCIJ), which supervised the operation of the Immigration Courts located throughout the United States. The Office of the Chief Administrative Hearing Officer (OCAHO) was established within EOIR in March of 1987. OCAHO is responsible for the administration of issues arising from the hearing process under employee sanctions, document fraud, and antidiscrimination provisions of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA) and the Immigration Act of 1990 (IMMACT). EOIR currently consists of the Office of the Director, BIA, OCIJ, OCAHO, and the Office of the Associate Director (OAD) which provides support to the various headquarters components and the Immigration Courts. OAD's areas of responsibilities include automated systems, space and facilities, personnel, and procurement.

The Attorney General, who is responsible for the administration and enforcement of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952 (INA) as well as all other laws relating to the immigration and naturalization of aliens, has delegated to EOIR the responsibilities of immigration hearings, review of immigration hearings, and employment discrimination, document fraud, and employer sanctions hearings. The mission of EOIR is "to ensure fairness, competence, effectiveness, and efficiency in decisions relating to the status of individual aliens in the United States" (Executive Office for Immigration Review, 1999). The EOIR website states the primary function of the agency is "to interpret immigration laws and conduct administrative hearings and appellate reviews" on a range of immigration issues.

OCIJ, which is headed by the Chief Immigration Judge, is responsible for providing overall program direction, policy and procedure development, and establishment of priorities for the Immigration Courts located throughout the United States. Currently OCIJ oversees Immigration Courts, which contain over 200 Immigration Judges, located in 50 cities. Also OCIJ, through the Immigration Courts, administers the Criminal Alien Institutional Hearing Program which adjudicates the immigration status of alien inmates incarcerated by Federal, State, and municipal correctional authorities as a result of criminal convictions.

The over 200 Immigration Judges conduct formal judicial proceedings and act independently in their decision-making capacity. They determine the facts in each case, apply the law, and render a decision. Decisions rendered by the Immigration Judges are administratively final, unless appealed or certified to the BIA. Immigration Judges decide if an alien placed in removal proceedings by the USINS should be allowed to enter the United States or should be removed. If the Immigration Judge decides deportability or inadmissability has been proven,

he/she then considers if any forms of relief are available to the individual. Asylum, cancellation of removal, adjustment of status, and voluntary departure are the major forms of relief available for the Immigration Judge to consider. Immigration Courts conduct in excess of 250,000 immigration hearings annually.

The San Antonio Immigration Court consists of three Immigration Judges, a Court Administrator, two Language Specialists (for the first two months of teleconferencing three Language Specialists were on staff), four Legal Technicians, and two student aides. The court is responsible for conducting non-detained and detained hearings in San Antonio, detained hearings at LSPC, and non-detained hearings at the Port of Entry in Laredo, Texas.

Below in Table 1 are the FY98 total receipts and completions respectively for each hearing location assigned to the San Antonio Immigration Court. The FY98 average overall pending caseload for the San Antonio Immigration Court was 1144.




Figure A: San Antonio To Laredo Map

Since its creation in 1983, the San Antonio Immigration Court has been responsible for conducting hearings at LSPC. The San Antonio Immigration Judges and other court personnel conducted detail trips to Laredo an average of 24 times per year. Figure A above illustrates the distance traveled for the details from San Antonio to Laredo. These details consisted of a week of immigration hearings for aliens being detained at the LSPC facility by USINS. The LSPC is managed by Corrections Corporation of America (CCA). The total bed capacity for the facility is 350 with USINS guaranteeing the use of a minimum of 250 beds.

Due to increasing detention costs and caseload, the USINS was eager to establish a full time Immigration Court at LSPC. However, USINS and CCA officials were unable to guarantee the necessary space and security upgrades within the detention facility required by the Chief Immigration Judge in order to establish a full time Immigration Court with a sitting Immigration Judge. Given the fact the San Antonio Immigration Court and USINS continued to conduct details to LSPC and the USINS and CCA officials could not make the necessary space

modifications necessary to establish a full time Immigration Court, the implementation of videoconferencing for immigration hearings at LSPC appeared to be a viable alternative. Implementation of Videoconferencing System

In 1993 the Institutional Hearing Program Video Teleconferencing (VTC) program began as a pilot project to prototype VTC capabilities linking an Immigration Court and a remote detention facility. The two locations selected were the Chicago Immigration Court and the Federal Detention Facility in Lexington, Kentucky. The first VTC session was conducted in October 1993. In October 1995, the first sites to conduct immigration proceedings on a regular basis were the Baltimore Immigration Court and the Wicomico Detention Facility in Salisbury, Maryland. Shortly after the implementation of the videoconferencing equipment in the Baltimore Immigration Court, the Dallas Immigration Court, as well as a few other Immigration Courts, came on line with the videoconferencing equipment. The Dallas Immigration Court conducted teleconferencing hearings for detained aliens in the Big Springs Prison. The videoconferencing equipment for the Immigration Courts was paid for and installed by the USINS. Based on the positive comments being received from those Immigration Courts utilizing the new equipment, the USINS was interested in expanding these projects.

A site survey was conducted in San Antonio and Laredo in March, 1997 by Jim Moore, Communications Specialist with USINS Headquarters Data Communications Branch. In June of that year, Mr. Moore installed the videoconferencing equipment between the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC. After training was provided on the use of the new equipment, immigration hearings were conducted between the two sites in late June.

The videoconferencing systems located at the San Antonio Immigration Court and the

LSPC are VTEL TC2000 ESA systems. These systems provide two way real time audio and video capabilities. Each system consists of a 27" color television monitor, a pan/tilt/zoom camera, microphones, speakers, and a high speed Pentium processor. Each system is also equipped with an ELMO document camera.

Gruen and Wetter (1997) identify four major courtroom design and system layout

concerns with videoconferencing:

- (1) <u>Conflict between the aesthetics of the room and efficient video</u>: Unlike audio, which the concern is primarily sound reflection, efficient video involves proper lighting and placement. In order to heighten visibility and reduce glare, a combination of direct and indirect light should be utilized when initially establishing a location for the equipment within the courtroom. During the initial site survey, Mr. Moore discussed the need for proper lighting within the courtroom. Due to the San Antonio courtroom having several windows, it was decided a special drape liner should be installed. The LSPC courtroom did not have such lighting concerns.
- (2) <u>Placement of equipment within the room design</u>: Obviously if a courtroom is going to be built specifically for videoconferencing, coordination of architectural plans and video design is critically important to a well functioning teleconferencing system. However, in most cases, courtrooms are adapted for the videoconferencing layout. The cameras produce a better quality picture if a head-on shot of the person is established. The best scenario is to set the camera in such a position that the picture reflects the person as if he or she were speaking to the camera. Fortunately, the existing courtrooms in San Antonio and the LSPC allowed for this type of camera setup.
- (3) <u>Placement and size of display monitors</u>: Simply put, the placement and size of the monitors should provide viewing ease to the participants. Individuals should not appear to be larger than life nor should they appear to unusually small. The 27" monitors placed in San Antonio and the LSPC seem to properly address this concern.
- (4) Equipment flexibility: Videoconferencing systems should be designed to ensure modifications can be made without major renovation or cost. The videoconferencing system installed in San Antonio and the LSPC certainly has the capability of modification through the existing equipment (ability to videotape hearings, utilization of expanded camera features, etc.).

The San Antonio Immigration Court was fortunate to have an extra courtroom which was

converted into the "televideo courtroom" without renovation costs. Below Figures B and C illustrate the videoconferencing equipment layout in each hearing location.




Figure B: Videoconferencing Layout-San Antonio Immigration Court




Figure C: Videoconferencing Layout-Laredo Service Processing Center

In addition to the videoconferencing equipment, the televideo courtroom was equipped with a computer monitor with access to the Automated Nationwide System for Immigration Review (ANSIR) which is the database network utilized by the Immigration Courts to process and track case records. A laser printer and fax machine were also installed for the printing and distribution of notices and orders. A Coherent teleconferencing unit was installed in each courtroom for utilization with off site attorneys and interpreters.

The San Antonio and LSPC locations link to each other by one site placing a video call over FTS2000 Switched Digital Service (SDS) circuits provided by U.S. Sprint. Each location has six 56 kilobits per second (56kbps) SDS circuits with an assigned "700" video number. Video calls are placed by dialing the 700 video number of the distant end's location. The six 56 kbps circuits are multiplexed together in a <u>B</u>andwith <u>On D</u>emand (BONDing) mode to provide a total bandwidth of 336 kbps, with a frame rate of 30 frames per second (30 fps). Each time a video call is placed a process to compress and digitize the signal is performed through a Codec/<u>DEC</u>oder (CODEC) at the calling location. Once the compressed digitized signal is received by the distant end's CODEC, the process is reversed. Basically a CODEC is a computer which utilizes mathematical formulae in order to describe the video pictures and sounds that it receives from cameras and microphones. The VTC systems can operate in either it's proprietary communication/videoconferencing protocols or the International Telecommunications Union - Telecommunications (ITU-T) protocols which allows the system to link with other vendors' VTC systems and not be limited to VTC links solely between the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC.

#### Effectiveness of the Laredo Videoconferencing Project

The benefits mentioned most often in the literature examined on teleconferencing (Arnstein & Goodwin, 1994; Cotter, 1995; Crews, 1996; Raburn-Remfry 1994; St. Vrain & Hanser, 1997; Thaxton, 1993) are (1) cost effectiveness; (2) more efficient case processing ; (3) security enhancement; and (4) reduction of health concerns. Specific data related to the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC Project will be examined in terms of cost effectiveness and the impact, if any, on case processing after the implementation of videoconferencing.

Given the ongoing reduction in cost of videoconferencing systems, the ability for a system to "pay for itself" in terms of travel costs saved continues to be enhanced. The San

Antonio/LSPC system proved to be cost effective in one year of operation. The travel costs associated with 24 detail trips to Laredo from San Antonio for the Immigration Judge and interpreter/clerk from the Immigration Court and one USINS attorney totaled approximately \$32,400 (\$450 per person per detail). The cost of the videoconferencing equipment and installation was approximately \$30,000. The total Sprint rate for the San Antonio/LSPC system in the initial year was approximately \$3,500. Thus the initial cost of the videoconferencing system was roughly \$33,500 as compared to \$32,400 of travel costs associated with one year of details to Laredo.

Cost effectiveness includes not only monetary savings, such as reduced transportation/travel costs, but also time savings. Certainly the San Antonio/LSPC videoconferencing system avoids the lost time in travel to the facility. Monday mornings and Friday afternoons were designated as the travel times for the details. Essentially the detail week was reduced to four days due to the travel required. Depending on the number of individual case settings in a given detail week, approximately four to five Master Calendar sessions were conducted by the traveling Immigration Judge. The same number of Master Calendar sessions are conducted via videoconferencing with the major difference being these hearings are conducted every week instead of every two to three weeks.

The ability for the Immigration Court to conduct more timely detained hearings is not only a cost effectiveness benefit of the videoconferencing system, but also a case processing benefit. Immigration Court proceedings do not commence until the USINS files a charging document with the court (8 C.F.R. § 3.14 (a)). In Table 2 below are the average number of days from receipt of

the charging document by the Immigration Court to the initial hearing then to completion of the case.

Based on the data reflected in Table 2, it appears, at least to some degree, the San Antonio/LSPC videoconferencing project has addressed the notion of "justice delayed is justice denied" in a positive manner. In FY97, the average number of days from receipt of the charging document to completion of the case was 34 days. In FY98, the first complete fiscal year of videoconferencing operation, the average number of days from receipt of the charging document to completion of the case was 16 days. Even though the difference in average days from receipt of the charging document to the initial hearings from FY97 to FY98 was minimal (14 percent decrease), the differences in average days from initial hearing to case completion and receipt of the charging document to case completion were substantial with a decrease of approximately 63 percent and 53 percent respectively.

Another benefit derived from the installation of the videoconferencing system which indirectly addresses the notion of "justice delayed is justice denied" is the increased representation for aliens being housed at the LSPC facility. More immigration practitioners are located in the San Antonio area than in the area surrounding Laredo. San Antonio attorneys who normally

would not represent a detained alien in Laredo because of the distance to the facility and the fact they more than likely would have a case during a given week within the San Antonio Immigration Court were more readily available to represent an alien scheduled for a televideo hearing.

As stated above, Immigration Court proceedings do not commence until the USINS has filed a charging document with the court. Detained aliens may be incarcerated for a period of time before the filing of a charging document by USINS with the Immigration Court. Also, even if an Immigration Judge issues an order of removability or inadmissability against a detained alien and his/her decision is not appealed, the USINS is responsible for executing the order which may mean the individual remains in custody while travel documents are acquired, travel plans are arranged, etc. Taking those factors into account, the average day figures in Table 2 reflect a substantial savings in detention costs on the average. In FY97, if an individual was detained for 34 days prior to receiving a final order from the Immigration Judge, based on a cost of \$45 per day paid by the USINS to the LSPC, the detention costs would be approximately \$1530 for that period of time. In FY98 and even with an increase to \$49 per day in the contracted detention cost between the USINS and the LSPC, the cost of detaining an individual for 16 days would be approximately \$784 which represents a decrease of 49%.

The Laredo Videoconferencing Project definitely addressed the safety and health concerns associated with the details to the detention facility. Obviously the detained aliens do not pose a security risk to the individuals located in the San Antonio Immigration Court courtroom. Given the criminal records of many of the detained aliens at the LSPC, the elimination of this security

risk for 24 weeks a year is a tremendous benefit derived from the videoconferencing system. The implementation of the videoconferencing equipment also removed the security and safety risks involved with personnel traveling the over 300 miles round-trip between San Antonio and Laredo. The majority of the route between San Antonio and Laredo involves isolated areas which certainly create various security and safety concerns for travelers.

Detained aliens represent one of the highest risk groups for tuberculosis and hepatitis B. Combine this already high risk population with a small courtroom which has average ventilation, the risk of an individual being exposed to tuberculosis or hepatitis B is greatly increased. As with the security concerns, the Laredo videoconferencing system completely eliminated the health concerns posed by in person hearings at the detention facility.

As one examines the current literature regarding videoconferencing, the primary focus seems to be on the benefits and positive results from the utilization of the technology in various judicial proceedings. One would almost conclude videoconferencing has no drawbacks or weaknesses within the judicial environment. It seems the trumpeting of all the positive aspects of the technology are primarily driven by the economic benefits discussed above which is understandable given the financial limitations faced by federal agencies and the judiciary. However, certain liabilities resulting from the use of videoconferencing equipment have been identified (Cotter, 1995; Grube, 1992; Raburn-Remfry 1994; Thaxton, 1993) and should be considered when implementing a videoconferencing system. The liabilities most often identified are (1) due process and policy concerns; (2) loss of control over the courtroom environment; (3) inadequate training on the operation of the equipment; and (4) lack of coordination between the parties conducting teleconferencing hearings.

Videoconferencing: Laredo 23

Raburn-Remry (1994) identifies four due process issues associated with the electronic production of defendants. The issues discussed are a defendant's right to be arraigned in open court, to be present at critical stages of the prosecution, to confront his/her accuser, and to be free from testimonial compulsion. Thaxton (1993), in addition to the above due process concerns, argues certain policy issues are created by the utilization of videoconferencing. According to Thaxton, the technology has altered the atmosphere of the courtroom by heightening the "existing depersonalization of the criminal justice process, contributing to defendants' feelings of alienation.". Also the use of videoconferencing technology "will fuel a defendant's suspicion, distrust, and frustration with the criminal justice system.".

In Immigration Court proceedings, the Immigration Judge "may conduct hearings through video conference to the same extent as he or she may conduct hearings in person (8 C.F.R. § 3.25 (8) (e)). Under this same regulation, the Immigration Judge may conduct a hearing telephonically, but if it involves an evidentiary hearings on the merits, the alien must consent after being "advised of the right to proceed in person, or, where available, through a video conference...". Most Immigration Judges I have spoken with about conducting merits hearings via videoconferencing believe the alien should also consent to that form of hearing. Thaxton (1993) argues even though procedures are present which allow defendants to decline the use of videoconferencing, they will feel compelled not to "buck the system" with the belief their cooperation will result in a more lenient outcome. Lee Teran, Clinical Professor of Law with the Center for Legal and Social Justice at St. Mary's University in San Antonio feels in immigration proceedings detained aliens are even more inclined to not "buck the system". According to Ms. Teran, the Center for Legal and Social and Social Justice does not represent aliens incarcerated at LSPC as much as in the past because

videoconferencing equipment, the coordination of activities between the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC was, and still remains, the most critical aspect of a properly functioning videoconferencing system with the only exception being the functioning of the equipment itself. The coordination of the calendars and the movement of the individuals in and out of the courtroom are more difficult due to the fact that court personnel are not on site at the LSPC. According to one of the San Antonio Immigration Judges, a problem continues to exist with guaranteeing an alien has received the proper document from the USINS officer in the courtroom and these documents are properly completed. These forms primarily involve the applications for various forms of relief which the alien wishes to apply for and which the Immigration Judge will consider during the individual's hearing and fingerprint cards. In the following section, recommendations for implementing an efficient videoconferencing system are presented which includes the effective coordination of activities between the videoconferencing sites.

#### Factors for Effective Implementation of a Videoconferencing System

Arnstein and Goodwin (1994) identify four key issues for successfully implementing a videoconferencing system in a court. These issues are (1) procedures; (2) project management;

(3) training; and (4) staffing.

(1) <u>Procedures</u>: Arnstein and Goodwin stress the importance of coordinating procedural changes when multiple agencies are involved. Based on my experience in San Antonio, this particular point cannot be emphasized enough. In other words, one cannot plan too much when implementing such a system. As with any new system, all of the procedures cannot be developed in advance of the implementation simply because situations will be encountered which could not be anticipated in advance. However, the best approach is to involve all the participating project parties from the beginning to make certain all interests are addressed. Given the time frame we were under for beginning videoconferencing hearings from the LSPC, as stated previously, we did not have the luxury of time for the complete development of procedures. As with many projects, each agency focused on its internal procedures with minimal

communication with the other project parties. If I was implementing a videoconferencing system again, I would attempt to conduct a series of "mock hearings" in order to ascertain the coordination issues we would be confronted with by the use of the new system. Pearce (1996) discusses the use of a Video Arraignment Committee when Hamilton County, Indiana implemented video arraignments. Such a committee would have been of great benefit for the Laredo project. In addition to Immigration Court, USINS, and LSPC personnel, members from the private bar and pro bono representatives should have developed a committee to discuss ongoing issues related to the videoconferencing system.

- (2) <u>Project Management</u>: A project manager is necessary for the proper coordination of the ongoing videoconferencing system from implementation through the daily operation of the project. In the case of the Laredo project, as with any of the Immigration Court installations, the project management responsibility is a part of the Court Administrator's duties. Unfortunately, with all the regular duties of the Court Administrator, the daily operation of the court does not always allow for the time necessary for project management within the court. Fortunately, Mr. Moore does an outstanding job of assisting the Court Administrators with the necessary steps for preparing the site for the installation of the equipment. However, once again, the coordination of the activities as to the daily operation of the system would be well served by the above mentioned committee or a very small working group within the Immigration Court. Pearce (1996) discusses the need for an implementation plan for videoconferencing. The Hamilton County implementation plan addresses procedures related to location, waiver of appearance, staffing, rights video, communication, furniture and fixtures at the jail, furniture and fixtures in the courtroom, the video and audio equipment, and maintenance and inventory of equipment.
- (3) <u>Training</u>: Arnstein and Goodwin emphasize the need for adequate time and resources for training on the operation of the videoconferencing system as well as the procedures. As previously discussed, time can be the greatest barrier to properly addressing the training issue. However, the benefits gained from making certain all parties are properly trained and comfortable with the equipment and understand the new procedures are worth any minor delay in beginning the videoconferencing hearings. Delays encountered from equipment failures cannot be avoided, but delays due to individuals not understanding how to operate the equipment or how to procedurally handle a particular matter should be avoided as much as possible because those types of delays will impact the overall operation of the videoconferencing system on an ongoing basis until adequately addressed. I certainly support the development of any type of resource materials, such as the Laredo televideo manual, which will make it easier for personnel to operate the equipment and to carry out the procedures.

(4) <u>Staffing</u>: The complexity of the particular videoconferencing system will determine the

necessary level of staffing required to operate the system. The system in the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC, while certainly adequate, is not an overly sophisticated system. The benefit of such a system is additional staffing is not necessary for the operation of the system. Existing court personnel will have additional responsibilities associated with the utilization of the videoconferencing equipment, but it does not require a full time staff assignment.

#### **Conclusion**

Due to the reduction in cost and the resulting cost effectiveness of the systems, videoconferencing technology will be utilized more and more by the courts. The videoconferencing system implemented between the San Antonio Immigration Court and the LSPC can certainly be considered a success based on the cost savings, both in time and money, the ability to process cases in a more timely, efficient manner, and the elimination of security and health concerns. However, we must be willing to address the liabilities and concerns which have been raised regarding the impact of the technology on judicial proceedings. Future examinations of the videoconferencing systems in the Immigration Courts should somehow focus on the perceptions of the aliens whose hearings have been conducted via televideo as well as the concerns by the immigration bar. Proper planning, ongoing coordination and communication, and a willingness to continue to evaluate the impacts of the videoconferencing system on all the parties affected by it will assure the gains from such technology will outweigh any liabilities. SUBJECT: Interim Operating Policies and Procedures Memorandum No. 04-06: Hearings Conducted through Telephone and Video Conference

On July 22, 2004, this office issued Operating Policies and Procedures Memorandum (OPPM) No. 04-04 which provided guidance for cases in which an immigration judge conducts a hearing through telephone or video conference. OPPM No. 04-04 has been rescinded and replaced with Interim OPPM No. 04-06 Hearings Conducted Through Telephone and Video Conference.

OPPM No. 04-04 has been rescinded and replaced with interim policy to further clarify how our courts should be handling telephone conference or video conference hearings and to provide examples of the orders that should be issued in these cases. The interim policy makes clear that the law to be applied to a hearing conducted by telephone or video conference is the law governing the location where the case is docketed for a hearing, regardless of whether the immigration judge or a party to the proceeding participates by telephone or video conference. Section III of the new OPPM No. 04-06 provides examples and formats that should assist the court in handling video conference hearings.

Please discard the rescinded OPPM No. 04-04, and replace it with the attached new OPPM No. 04-06.

SUBJECT: Interim Operating Policies and Procedures Memorandum No. 04-06: Hearings Conducted through Telephone and Video Conference

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#### I. INTRODUCTION

This OPPM supersedes OPPM No. 04-04, <u>Hearings Conducted Through Telephone</u> <u>Conference and Video Conference</u>, and sets forth new interim uniform procedures for conducting and handling Telephone and Video Conference hearings. These procedures are interim in nature, and will continue to be revised and reformulated to reflect any changes that may be necessary.

#### II. CREATING A CLEAR RECORD OF THE LOCATION OF THE HEARING

The regulation at 8 C.F.R. § 1003.14 provides that "[j]urisdiction vests, and proceedings before an Immigration Judge commence, when a charging document is filed with the Immigration Court by the Service [now Department of Homeland Security (DHS)]." When a charging document is filed with an Administrative Control Immigration Court pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 1003.11, the proceedings may actually take place in a location other than where the charging document is filed. Thus, it is important to record the actual location of the hearing.

An immigration judge who conducts a hearing either telephonically or through video conference must create a clear record of where the hearing is taking place. At the beginning of each session of the hearing, the immigration judge must identify himself or herself for the record. The immigration judge must note that he or she is sitting via telephone or video conference and identify the specific hearing location where he or she is conducting the hearing (i.e., the location where the case is docketed for hearing). All hearing locations are published in the Office of the Chief immigration judge's Administrative Control List. This list is made available to the public pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 1003.11, and is available on the Executive Office for Immigration Review's (EOIR) Intranet and Internet.

In addition, the immigration judge should note the location of the respondent, the respondent's counsel or representative, if any, and counsel for the DHS, in order to create a clear and complete record. For example, at the beginning of a hearing conducted through video conference by an immigration judge in Chicago who is conducting a hearing in our Kansas City, Missouri, hearing location, the immigration judge should state: "This is Immigration Judge John Doe of the Chicago Immigration Court sitting, via video conference, at the hearing location in Kansas City, Missouri. The respondent, the respondent's attorney, and the attorney for the DHS are all present in Kansas City, Missouri." In this example the immigration judge identified Kansas City, Missouri, as the hearing location because the case was docketed for a hearing in Kansas City, Missouri. The immigration judge's participation in the hearing through video conference did not change the hearing location.

The immigration judge must follow the steps outlined above each time he or she commences a session of a hearing through video or telephone conference. In addition, the circuit law that is to be applied to proceedings conducted via telephone or video conference is the law governing the hearing location (i.e., **the location where the case is docketed for hearing**). In the example set forth above, the law applied would be that governing Kansas City, Missouri, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit.

#### III. ORDERS AND DECISIONS ISSUED IN HEARINGS THROUGH TELEPHONE OR VIDEO CONFERENCE

Any order or decision by an immigration judge in a hearing conducted through video or telephone conference where the case was docketed for a hearing location (as opposed to an administrative control court/base city court) must include the hearing location (not the administrative control court/base city court) in the caption. The order or decision must include a statement that the hearing was conducted through video or telephone conference and a statement that sets forth the administrative control court and address for purposes of correspondence and post-hearing motions.

In an effort to promote uniformity in procedures, the following examples are provided. It should be noted that the ANSIR **minute order form** will be modified to create this standard form. In the interim, the court should create a Word Perfect version of each of the minute orders (Attachment A and B) until IRM can program them into ANSIR and subsequently CASE.

- 1. Attachment A is an example of an ANSIR **Minute Order** issued by an immigration judge who conducted a video conference hearing for a case docketed at an administrative control court/base city court. In this example, a New York immigration judge conducted a hearing through video conference for a case docketed in Detroit, Michigan. Note that a minute order from the Detroit Immigration Court is used and at the bottom of this order there is a notation that the matter was handled through video or telephone conference.
- 2. Attachment B is an example of an ANSIR **Minute Order** issued by an immigration judge who conducted a video conference hearing for a case docketed at a "hearing location" (a site other than an administrative control court/base city court). In this example, a Chicago immigration judge conducted a hearing through video conference for a case docketed in Kansas City, Missouri. Note that the "hearing location" is listed in the heading and that the address for the administrative control court and a notation that the matter was handled through video or telephone conference are listed at the bottom of the order.
- 3. Attachment C is an example of a Written Decision/Order/Other Memoranda issued by an immigration judge who conducted or is conducting a video conference hearing for a case docketed at a "hearing location" (a site other than an administrative control court/base city court). In this example, a Chicago immigration judge rendered a written decision for a case docketed in Kansas City, Missouri. Note that the "hearing location" is listed in the heading, and a sentence has been inserted in the body of the decision indicating that the matter was heard by video conference followed by a footnote that sets forth the specific hearing location and the address of the administrative control for this hearing location.

4. Attachment D is an example of the appropriate heading and caption for the Oral Decision of the Immigration Judge where the hearing was conducted by video conference. Note that in rendering the oral decision the immigration judge must inform the transcriber to place the hearing location (the place where the case was docketed for hearing) in the heading. The immigration judge will also instruct the transcriber to state in the body of the decision that the matter was heard by video conference at the hearing location (i.e., the location where the case was docketed for hearing) followed by a footnote. The footnote should state that "all correspondence and documents pertaining to the case must be filed with the administrative control court" at the listed address. However, if this hearing was conducted by video conference for a case docketed at an administrative control court/base city court, it would not be necessary to include the above mentioned footnote.

#### IV. CONCLUSION

This memorandum has been issued in an effort to promote efficiency of operations and uniformity of procedures in handling or conducting immigration hearings through video or telephone conference.
