**DEFENDANTS’ CROSS-MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT**

The American Immigration Lawyers Association (“AILA,” or “Plaintiff”) brings this action against the United States Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) and the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (“USCIS”), a DHS subdivision, under the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended, challenging the USCIS’s response to several FOIA requests the AILA submitted in 2009. As of the date of this motion, the USCIS has satisfied all of its obligations with respect to the AILA’s FOIA requests. The USCIS has conducted adequate searches for responsive records and has produced all responsive, reasonably segregable, non-exempt information to which the AILA is entitled by law.

No material facts are in dispute. The USCIS thus respectfully moves the Court, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 56, for summary judgment as to all claims the AILA asserts in this action. The USCIS respectfully submits that the statement of material facts not in genuine dispute, memorandum of points and authorities, Declaration of Jill A. Eggleston, and accompanying exhibits filed concurrently with this motion establish that the USCIS is entitled to summary judgment.
